

ACTIVITY REPORT – FEBRUARY 2015
COUNTY OF SULLIVAN INDUSTRIAL DEVELOPMENT AGENCY

January 28, 2015

The IDA held its regular meeting on January 12, 2015. Chairman Steingart started the meeting by thanking the Board and staff for all their efforts to make the casino proposal a success. At the meeting several changes to the committees for 2015 were made to reflect new Board membership. Additionally, after holding a public hearing the Board passed a resolution appointing Sullivan Property Acquisitions I, LLC as agent for the old Apollo Plaza site project which will include 188,000 square feet of retail space and 12,000 square feet of office space. The IDA held its document signing closing for this project on January 23rd.

In January, work continued on the Red Meat project in the Village of Liberty. Delivery of the facility building occurred in early December with construction work estimated to be completed early in 2015. Work continued on drafting the request for proposals for operation of the facility, and networking with potential operators to generate interest. Bid openings for some facility equipment occurred, along with the process of procuring other equipment item quotes. Staff continues to monitor all grant requirements and track the overall project budget.

A member of the IDA staff attended a two day educational New York Economic Development Conference in Albany. Workshops included an Office of the State Comptroller training session and an IDA Best Practices discussion. Breakout sessions attended included: The Role of Retail in Economic Development, Workforce Development, and Developing Downtowns.

IDA staff continued working on sending out the PILOT bills, and information needed for the FY 2014 PARIS report is being accumulated, including employment numbers. Work to facilitate the agency's 2014 audit has also begun.

With respect to other agricultural economic development programs and initiatives, IDA staff continues to attend meetings of the Sullivan County Legislature's Ag Advisory Board. Staff also attends meetings of the Advisory Board's farmland protection planning subcommittee and also assists the Sullivan County Planning Division in its development of a local dairy processing facility.

The Agency worked with several small businesses regarding IDA and Sullivan County Funding Corp (SCFC) loan programs.

Report to Legislature February 2015

A. General Operations

1) **Casino Update**

- SCP in partnership with CWD has been actively moving forward with the coordination of a large scale concerted workforce development and training effort to prepare for anticipated skill set requirements for direct/indirect jobs associated with the development. We have spoken to SCCC, BOCES, CCE, SCVA, SC Chamber, Empire and Adelaar, and all have conceptually agreed that bringing together the strengths of each organization under one concerted effort to prepare our workforce for the coming demand is critical. The first exploratory meeting has been tentatively scheduled. The scale and timeline of this project demands that we move much quicker than what is done traditionally or that can be done by any one agency. The goal is to begin to identify and put together training certifications through an efficient process that trains individuals for specific job categories and ultimately provides them with an opportunity to fill employment demand. The final touches are being put on a survey of top employers as well as needs assessment which will take place to better understand existing conditions and prepare for future demands through a full scale labor shed analysis.

2) **Internal/External Marketing –**

- The 2nd Annual SEQRA Conference was held with a great turnout once again. Over 120 engineers, attorneys, municipal officials and interested parties attended the 4.5 hour long event earning continuing educations credits toward their profession and getting an up close and personal education on the myriad issues that face developers, planning boards and associated professionals in carrying out the requirements of the SEQRA process.
- The SCP membership drive continues in earnest as we work to grow the organization and prepare for the increased activity that has already begun. We look forward to even more participation from the private sector in support of our economic development mission.
- **NYSEDC** – we have re-engaged our relationship with the New York State Economic Development Council, The New York State Economic Development Council is the state's principal organization representing economic development professionals. Its 900 members include the leadership of Industrial Development Agencies, Local Development Corporations, commercial and investment banks, underwriters, bond counsels, utilities, chambers of commerce and private corporations. I recently attended their Economic Development Conference focusing primarily on the workforce development session as that is a priority for us now.

3) **Community Outreach** – I have presented to the Stewart Airport Commission at their board meeting this morning. Stewart Airport should be an integral part of transporting visitors to Sullivan County. While the SCVA has always maintained a good working relationship with the airport the recent approvals should also spark more interest in travelers utilizing the airport to

access our area much more conveniently. Exploration of new transportation options to and from the airport, how we utilize our own airport among other topics are certainly on the table.

B. Project Updates

a. Corporate Attraction

- Veria Lifestyle continues to work at the former Kutcher's site in its cleanup effort before beginning its official development phase. The effort has been delayed due to some unforeseen additional work needed to be completed before moving forward but the resort development plans are moving forward.
- We have responded to a lead for a green bio-friendly liquid battery manufacturer developed at MIT. A Start Up NY candidate the project would be consistent with SCCC's green renewable energy efforts. TBD.
- We have submitted a site proximate to SCCC for consideration for a cheese processing facility. The firm would be eligible for Start Up as it falls within the 1 mile threshold. The site has access to water and sewer which is a must. The project falls within SCCC's world nutritional arts focus.
- We have been approached by a firm that produces Hydro-Coils for Hydro electric applications. The firm has looked at an existing building and has genuine interest in 10,000sq. ft. The firm will require 35 jobs to start and ramp up to 100 by year three. Negotiations are underway with facility owner. *Update: TBD*
- A local business man is in the process of purchasing a spark plug manufacturing business and will be relocating it to Sullivan County. The business is a 100 year old firm and currently produces for the wholesale market internationally. The new owner plans to introduce a consumer division which will create many more jobs than the five it now requires and more expansion investment as well. *Update: Developing business plan and final financing.*
- We are in discussions with a New York City chef interested in establishing a chocolate factory in Sullivan County. He has been touring several hamlets as part of his due diligence. The gentleman has ties to the area. *Update: Two areas have been toured, Livingston Manor and Hurleyville. A business plan is being developed at this time based on where the prospect will ultimately choose as a location. The principal has contact SCP as well as IDA and we will be meeting collectively with interested stakeholders to provide economic development assistance where possible to see this project to fruition. Awaiting business plan and decision by applicant.*
- We have met with an NYC producer of Healthy Fruit juices. They are looking to establish a processing facility in Sullivan County. May be a Start Up NY candidate. *Update: Principal will be meeting with SCCC to explore mutually beneficial steps moving forward today.*

b. Small Business/Entrepreneurial Development

- The Partnership Revolving Loan Committee will be reviewing an application for a film production/editing startup looking to establish a facility in Sullivan County. A location and the bulk of financing is in place. TBD
- We are awaiting application and business plan submittal for a automotive body shop and repair expansion. The project would relocate existing facility and create two full time jobs.

- IWW funds available \$149,325. There are currently 11 loans within this program:

d. Shovel Ready Sites

An existing owner of a key development site along the Old Route 17 corridor is in the process of updating engineering, addressing site plan changes, and finalizing "Shovel Ready" status on the property. As an owner of several key parcels in the Thompson/Liberty area the principal is looking to move ahead in the areas of workforce development retail and Light Industrial applications, all stemming from the Casino licensing decision. Update: Site owner is in the process of engaging new professionals to complete the project.

The goal is to better prepare our existing businesses to capitalize on this opportunity and to bring awareness to challenges if any, early on. There are other similar developments sure to follow. Update: In process.

- ❖ The CWD and the Partnership are leading the effort to create a comprehensive and coordinated workforce development plan that will address the employment and training needs of the county as a result of the coming large development projects. The first two areas of focus are:
 1. Bringing key economic development/workforce/education/business partners together to create a work group that will look to address the training, education and recruitment needs of the Montreign/Adalaar projects. This group will also include workforce, education and training partners from Orange and Ulster counties. First meeting will be in March.
 2. Secure funding for a comprehensive labor shed analysis and skills gap analysis. These studies will inform a workforce plan that will be comprehensive in scope and coordinated and efficient in its delivery.

- ❖ The 5th Annual Non-Profit Leadership Summit is scheduled for March 4th at Bethel Woods.
